Notice of Special District Meeting
Central School District No.2, Towns of Clifton Park,
Halfmoon, Malta, Waterford, Ballston and Stillwater,
Saratoga County, N.Y.

Notice is hereby given that a special district meeting of the inhabitants of Central School District No.2, Towns of Clifton Park, Halfmoon, Malta, Waterford, Ballston and Stillwater, Saratoga County, N.Y., qualified to vote at school meetings in said district, will be held at the schoolhouse at Round Lake, N.Y. in said district, on the 2nd day of August, 1950, at 8:00 o'clock, P.M. eastern daylight saving time, to adopt a budget for the school year 1950-1951, set the place for holding the annual meeting in 1951, and vote upon the following questions.

1- Shall the Board of Education be authorized to continue, where possible, the respective contractual relations in effect in each district prior to centralization for the instruction of pupils and expend the necessary sums for tuition and the transportation of the pupils of such districts, and raise the necessary sums therefore by tax on the taxable property of the Central District?

For the aforesaid purpose, shall the Central District designate the following schools: - District #1 Waterford, Waterford, N.Y., for grades kindergarten through 12; #1 Ballston, Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake Central School, Ballston Lake, N.Y., for grades 9-12; Halfmoon-Stillwater #10, Mechanicville, N.Y., for grades kindergarten through 12; Milton #1, Ballston Spa, N.Y., for grades 9-12; Glenville #15, Alplaus, N.Y., for grades kindergarten through 6. ?

2- Shall the Board of Education of Central School District No.2, Towns of Clifton Park, Halfmoon, Malta, Waterford, Ballston and Stillwater, Saratoga County, N.Y., be authorized and directed to purchase one or more school buses and expend therefore a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), which said sum shall be levied on the taxable property of the district, and be collected in five annual instalments of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00); and shall the said Board of Education of said district be authorized and directed in accordance with the provisions of the Education Law and the Local Finance Law to borrow on the credit of said district, the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary and issue bonds from the date thereof, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 2 1/2 % per annum, and that said bonds shall be five in number, one of which shall mature January 2, 1951, and one of which shall mature annually from said date until all of them are paid with the interest hereinbefore stated ?

3- Shall the district authorize the Board of Education to lease for school purposes for a five-year period, certain pieces or parcels of land at Round Lake and the buildings thereon known as "The George West Museum", now used for a schoolhouse, and "Lunatic Hall", and appropriate the necessary sums therefore and include same in the annual budgets ?
