

## Hatlee Spells Out Requirements

George A. Hatlee, supervisor of the Town of Halfmoon, has announced that the Town Board has approved the law pertaining to the partial tax exemption of real estate of aged persons granting a 50% tax exemption on real property owned by persons 65 years of age and meeting statutory qualifications. The Shenendehowa school district has also passed this bill so that a 50% tax exemption will include county, town and school tax.

The requirements are that all persons named on the deed must be over 65 years of age and have owned the property for at least 5 years and it must be the legal residence of the applicant or applicants and must be used for residential purposes only.

The income of the owner or the combined income of all owners must not exceed \$3000 for the 12 month period immediately preceding the date the an-
