Attorney Murphy: As the Board is aware of the status and has seen the presentation several times so this presentation will be very brief.

Kevin Dailey: Good evening Mr. Supervisor and Town Board members. I am here this evening on behalf of Boni Enterprises. Mr. Larry Boni is in the audience here tonight. We have been visiting with the Town Board and Planning Board off and on for a number of years and just to get you caught up on the presentation this evening:

- The parcel is 80 acres on Route 146 on the south side
- Proposal to amend the existing PDD to add a use for Senior Living Facilities
- Proposing 250 units in 2 large buildings on the SW corner of the property
- The entrance road has been moved farther west as the result of
 - Originally had a lg. archeological sensitive area. After the study the area has actually shrunk considerably in size
 - Also a wetland area and we have received a permit from the army core of engineers and Mr. Boni was able to fill in a specified amount of wetlands per the permit
 - Result of the archeological area and the wetlands area being shrunk, able to move the road to farther in. Now can put facilities on both sides of the road. Created an 11 acre parcel that has no wetlands on it and that we could use for development without going back to the army core of engineers for further permits at this time

We have aligned up an entity that wishes to build this facility for the town and need to do next is to do a study, need to go back to planning board for site plan approval and then deal with financing to lead to construction; this is predicated on the town approving the change in use which would be additional use which would allow that housing at that location.

Kevin Dailey: We have discussed the public benefit; the builder would be intent on building a pole barn for the town at the proposed location to house some of your equipment, we are please do to that and could be included in the legislation.
