Supervisor Tollisen: The first item on our agenda this evening is a Resolution that is honoring the Celebrations Association. The Halfmoon Celebrations Association has been around a long, long time since I was a kid. Lastly; I wanted to wish Judd a very Happy Birthday! Thank you!

Supervisor Tollisen: Now I would like to ask Nancy Morris to come up, the daughter of one of our founding members.

Nancy Morris: My Dad, Judd Morris's motto was always God and Church first, family second, and town and country third. He always put others before himself. He would set the groundwork and see things that needed to be done and do them. John Dudek, Supervisor, decided that the town needed a special day. He asked Kathy Marchione and Dad what they thought and they jumped at the chance to get things going and in 1985 organized a family day, entitled Halfmoon Day. In fact I think that they did it in about 1 or 2 months. Dad's desire was that it would be a day for everyone in the town, young, middle age, and seniors without any political ties. He chaired Halfmoon Day and the Celebrations Association for several years.

Kathy and Dad were a great team, who worked together to make Halfmoon the best! Not only did Kathy help things out, she also had her sons who worked for my Dad and of course my partner back here Kevin. I sometimes think and this is not anything bad, but I sometimes think that he thought of her as a second daughter.

On behalf of my Mom and myself I would like to thank the town board and the celebrations committee for recognizing his and Kathy's accomplishments.

I think it is very fitting that this recognition is happening on Dad's birthday. Thank you.

Supervisor Tollisen: I always remembered it was Judd's Birthday because it was tax day! This part of the meeting is over and we have set forth in the lobby some cookies and punch for you. I am going to join you for a couple of minutes out there and say thanks to you individually.

At this part of our meeting, I am going to recuse myself off the next matter and ask the Deputy Supervisor to take over the meeting.

PRESENTATION – AMENDMENT TO THE FALCON TRACE SENIOR LIVING PDD

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: At this time we will have a presentation of the Falcon Trace Senior Living PDD amendment.

Jeff Williams, from Bruce Tanski Construction & Development: I am here tonight to propose an amendment to the Falcon Trace Planned Development District or Falcon Trace PDD by asking for the creation of a third commercial lot. Falcon Trace PDD gained final site plan planning board approval in October 2010. The original Falcon Trace PDD allowed the creation of two commercial lots, they are known as Lot 2 and Lot 4 on the approved site plans.

Lot 2 is located at 2001 Fellows Road and is currently being utilized for a construction equipment repair and storage site. Lot 2 in not in consideration of tonight's proposed amendment and will remain as is.

Lot 4 is located at 173 Route 236. It is a 5.13-acre parcel that is directly across from the Town's recreation park and adjacent to the Jehovah's Witness site. Lot 4 has gained site plan approval from the planning board in 2014 and has further been re-approved on February 9,2015 to allow the construction of two 3,000 SF office buildings and one 4,000 SF office building with all conforming amenities such as parking, storm water controls, green space etc..

The applicant wishes to be able to market the 4,000 SF portion of the approved Lot 4 commercial site plan. In order to do so, it needs to be subdivided off of the rest of the parcel, in essence creating a third commercial lot.

The proposed creation of the third commercial lot would be created by subdividing the existing 5.13-acre Lot 4 into a 4.25- acre lot (Lot 4A) that would accommodate the two 3,000 SF commercial buildings and separate a 0.88-acre lot (Lot 4B) for the 4,000 SF building that we wish to sell.

This proposed amendment, asking to change the number of allowed commercial lots from two to three, will not expand the original boundaries as outlined in the original Falcon Trace POD. The creation of the third commercial lot will conform to the approved site plan for Lot 4, will create a conforming commercial lot per the Town's subdivision regulations and will conform to all other terms and regulations prescribed in the Falcon Trace POD and the Town's zoning ordinance. In closing we believe this proposed amendment will not alter the original intent of the commercial or any other portion of the Falcon Trace PDD. Thank you.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Are there any questions from the Board?

Councilman Wasielewski: Jeff, it is zoned commercial, did you have a retail office design in mind here?

Jeff Williams: It is zoned commercial, that allows commercial use there but what we did for site plans is proposed office building space basically. So we have two 2,000 SF office buildings and one 4,000SF office building.

Councilman Wasielewski: and not retail?

Jeff Williams: There is not any retail at this point. I do not think that we were considering that, just office space. That is an allowed use

Councilman Wasielewski: I was just wondering what your intentions were.

Councilwoman Jordan: I have one question and that is, I am not sure where we are in terms of the trail at Falcon Trace?

Jeff Williams: The trail was originally placed on the landscape plans of the original Falcon Trace PDD. It was also written into the PDD language that a trail would be created along Fellows Road and through the site. We have been through a number of discussions with the town because we looked at the area where the location of the trail was to be. There are a number of environmental constraints, deep slopes, some gullies and other things. We looked at other options and nothing came about. The latest proposal we have in front of the town is to place the trail along Fellows Road from Upper Newtown Road to the site of the senior facility of the Falcon Trace PDD. That trail right now is what we're proposing to be either an 8' or 5' wide whether the town wants to keep a uniformed; it can go from an 5' in one area to an 8' in another or a uniformed straight 5'. It is actually an extension of the shoulder of Fellows Road. It does give pedestrians and bikes an off road transient, but once it gets into Falcon Trace Senior, it will be a sidewalk from Falcon Trace Senior project to Route 236 across from the rec park. So that is what we have right now. We have been in discussion with the town trying to figure what is the best option, what does the town want and we just haven't come to an agreement amongst everybody yet.

Councilwoman Jordan: Thank you.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Jeff, all of the infrastructure, I mean you are going off the main road that is there now, there is nothing else that has changed correct? The main entrance from Falcon Trace, it is the same water and sewer?

Jeff Williams: Yes, the same, the site plan will remain the same, the footprint of the buildings are going to remain the same, the 4,000SF when we sell it off. Everything

on that site plan is going to remain the same. All we are asking for really is to create a third lot by subdividing off this third piece.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Is there any other questions from the Board?

Councilman Wasielewski: Do we need a negative SEQRA declaration?

Attorney Murphy: At this point, you would need to schedule a public hearing so that you can do the amendment to the PDD

Councilman Wasielewski: I make a motion to schedule a public hearing.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: And that will be on May 6th at 2:00 pm.

Attorney Murphy: The Planning Department has the detailed plans for the development of the park and the area that was deeded to the town at the time the

PDD was created. If you wanted to stop by there, they could show you. We have a conceptual idea but the y have the detailed plans

Leo Purvis: I was just wondering if there was going to be a lot of development there with the trails and the road going up to the falls or if was going to be just the trails and leaving it kind of natural

Supervisor Tollisen: It is my understanding that there is no discussion that there would be any type of vehicles or anything like that but to be more of a nature type of trail and enjoying the beauty of nature by walking or eventually bike riding.

Leo Purvis: It's a little tough to get up there right now. There is a parking area and a stone path that goes part of the way but maybe if anything could be done even if just the stone path up to make it a little easier to access. It is perfect the way it is, it is beautiful.

Councilwoman Jordan: If you have an interest in that you should come to one of Open Space and Trails Committee meetings which we have one this coming Monday at 7:00 pm.

Leo Purvis: Oh really, OK sounds good, thanks.

Supervisor Tollisen: Sir, thanks very much for your comments.

There being no further business to discuss or resolve, on a motion by Councilman Hotaling and seconded by Councilwoman Jordan, the meeting was adjourned at 7:48 pm.
