Councilman Polak said that on behalf of the Town Board of the Town of Halfmoon, Supervisor Wormuth, Councilmen Hayner, Wasielewski, and Hotaling and myself, on the outstanding work that you have done to become an Eagle Scout and for the beautiful project that you did along our trails in Crescent along the Towpath Trail. May I congratulate you one more time on everything that you have earned? May you continue to soar like the Eagle that you have become? Not only are we proud of you but the community here is too. Thank you very much.

Supervisor Wormuth said that we not only recognize our Eagle Scouts commitment and dedication to this process, but also his parents. We realize that it takes a very long period of time and a lot of dedication from the family to keep him on this track. Many people ask why I sit back and let Walter do this. I do it because Walter was actually our first Eagle Scout here in the Town of Halfmoon. I think that he has a much deeper understanding of that commitment and the love of Scouting than I do. When the words come from him they have much more meaning. Although, please know that all of the Board is very, proud of you Seren, and your family and your service to the community.

Councilman Polak said that he is also proud to tell everyone this evening that Seren's younger Brother will be Eagle Scout shortly. So there will be two Eagles in the same family and that is pretty much unheard of. Congratulations on that too.

Supervisor Wormuth stated that at his time we will go back to the Public Hearing for the re-zoning of the property known as 325 Route 146 from residential to commercial and available up front is a map. Our Town Planner will point out the parcel on the map. Any person who would like to come up and see the map or ask any questions, please do so.

Councilman Polak wanted to give a little bit more information on that. As you look at the map you will see that it is a remaining parcel. That whole island there is commercial except for that one piece. Why that piece did not get transferred over during the last Master Plan reviews was that was part of the Frank Pelo farm. When he sold the farm, and his residence on that side, he actually built a new home on the farm field side on the other side of the road. That left that piece being AR-1, agricultural residential. This is the only section of land in that area that is not a commercial piece. It is only common sense that we continue that commercial zone out in that area. Just a little bit of background as to why it was left like that during the last Master Plan.

Darlene Bagley; 24 Stone Quarry Rd asked what the future was for this property, do we know? What is the reason for making it commercial other than everything else is around it? Do we have plans?

Attorney Murphy stated that there is no proposal before the Planning Board with regards to that parcel as we sit here today. Our goal is to get into compliance with our Comprehensive Plan, Master Plan, and the different corrider that we have laid out. So it is inconsistent to have a residential property amongst a whole lot of commercial properties. It more a cleaning up as Mr. Polak said.

Darlene Bagley said that there is so much more residential property on Route 146

Attorney Murphy stated that not in that one corridor, that is the only one.

Darlene Bagley said that you do not have any future plans? This does not have anything to tie into the hospital coming or anything like that?

Attorney Murphy said no

There being no other comments or questions, the Supervisor closed the Public Hearing at 7:15 pm.

Through this program McDonald's is going to do some fundraising where 20% of all their sales will go back to the schools and teacher's which will benefit over 25,000 students. I would ask this Board to recognize the 5th annual Capitol Region McTeacher's Night on April 3rd, 2012.

Councilman Hayner stated that they had a productive couple of meetings last week. The Halfmoon Trails Committee met on Monday night of last week. The 6th Annual Crescent Canal Clean Sweep is going to be on Saturday April 21st. Everyone can meet down by the bridge by Stewart's. Then we breakout and pick up materials that have floated down by the river throughout the winter. This year should be a little less than usual. We get a great turnout between the Boy Scouts & Girl Scouts every year. We welcome the public to come and join in on that.

Next, I would like to mention that Paul Maiello, the Director of Parks gave a 25minute update on maintenance and things that they have been able to do with this mild winter. Maybe we can have him come in and update the Board as well.

We have our Town of Halfmoon Memorial Bench Program, which was announced at the last Town Board Meeting. For \$300.00 a family can sponsor a bench in the Park. I believe Madam Clerk that there have been three so far? We have 12 suggested locations in the Park, but can expand to other areas if asked.

We had our Ethic's Meeting last week. For two hours, we went through and dissected the Saratoga County Board of Ethics Legislation, and at the very end, started writing updated legislation to eventually bring to the Town Board for consideration.

Madam Clerk reported that the Senior Center will be holding their Spring Bazaar this Saturday from 9:00-2:00 pm. This is one of their two fundraisers for the year. They are having a Bake Sale and Grandma's Corner & all sorts of great things.

Attorney Murphy asked the Board to grant a resolution that permits Falcon Trace of Halfmoon PDD, temporary on site storage of domestic sanitary ethylene, consistent with the pumping schedule approved by our Town engineers, and all other provisions of Local Law 4-2009, obviously, will remain in full force and effect. Basically, what is happening is, and the Board is aware, there were some problems with the construction of the pump station due to no fault of the owner. That Saratoga County Sewer District is being accord with our continuing to allow the onsite storage with a regular pumping schedule, which has been happening. We additionally allowed this for a period of 50 days just to keep an eye on the progress and make sure everything is being complied with and it has been. We are being told by the Saratoga County Sewer District, that they expect that the situation will be resolved within 60 days. So, I would ask that the Board pass a resolution allowing that the on-site storage continues for an additional 60 days period.

Councilman Hotaling said that all of the effluents that are being taken out of the Falcon Trace PDD holding tank is being transferred down to the sewer plant and is on record of what is being disposed of and they are taking care of it as if it were being pumped down ther, e so it is all being taken care of.

Dear Ms. Wormuth:

I am writing in response to your October 17, 2011 letter, on behalf of the Town Board, requesting a speed limit reduction on Route 146 in the vicinity of the Sheldon Hills Development.

The Region 1 Traffic Safety and Mobility office conducted speed limit investigations of the 55 MPH section of Route 146 between Upper Newton Road (end of the 45 MPH speed zone) and Pruyn Hill Road in 2002 and 2008. Based on each of these investigations, it was determined that a reduction of the speed limit was not warranted at that time.

In response to your recent letter, we again conducted an extensive review of this section of highway for a speed limit reduction. Included in each of our past studies and our most recent study, we collected radar speed measurements of traffic traveling through this corridor. These speed measurements consistently find most motorists to be travelling at or below the 55 MPH speed limit, with generally 10% to 20% of traffic exceeding the posted speed limit. Based on this information, a speed limit reduction would not be effective unless it received regular and aggressive enforcement.

With that being said, I can appreciate your concerns and those of the residents who live along or must regularly enter into this section of highway. Therefore, we will extend the 45 MPH speed limit on Route 146 further east to Pruyn Hill Road. It is suggested that the Town of Halfmoon work with the State Police and Saratoga County Sheriff, both of whom will be receiving a copy of this letter, to have this proposed speed zone periodically enforced. Our experience has shown that, without enforcement or the threat of enforcement, the speed limit will be ignored and the reduction will have failed to address your safety concerns and those of the residents.

We have written a Notice of Order extending the existing 45 MPH speed limit on Route 146 further east to Pruyn Hill Road. This Order is currently being filed with the Secretary of State. We will arrange to have the appropriate speed limit signs installed as our workload and the weather permit.

Thank you for your interest in traffic safety and taking the time to call this location to our attention.
