They are separate grants. She wanted to clarify in case there was any confusion as to why it looks like we are doing 3 simultaneous resolutions. They are a little different.

She asked if that the letter is in receipt of the Clerk's office.

Madam Clerk stated that she has received the letter.

**Supervisor Wormuth** stated that we would make sure the letter is attached with it and hope that as we continue to work with DOT, perhaps we will be more successful with this than we have been in the past.

**RESOLVED,** that the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to make the Transfer between Appropriations and Creation of Appropriations.

# The Supervisor opened public privilege for discussion of non-agenda items.

**Donna Monroe, 21 Upper Newtown Road** stated that she had submitted a letter to the Town Board on April 20, 2011 about the situation with the parking lot to the walking trail being quite close to her home. She stated that Supervisor Wormuth has walked the area with her husband, and she was wondering if anything has come of that.

**Supervisor Wormuth** stated that she has a meeting scheduled with the engineers to look into the original design of the trail plan, as well as the Director of Parks to look at it. Her concern is doing improvements on Town property that would benefit a private resident and whether or not that would interfere with the NYSEG easement, which she has the Planning department researching.

**Donna Monroe** was not there the day Supervisor Wormuth met with her husband and wanted to make sure everything was covered. She stated that first and foremost was the safety of her house as well as the safety of the neighboring houses near the path. She said that people walk after dark on the path and she has had to call the police. She stated that 2 weeks ago she called the Sheriff's because there was a car parked at 9:30 at night. She had also taken pictures on her cell phone if anyone wanted to see them. The Sheriff waited until the gentleman came back to his car. It turned out that he told the Sheriff that he was actually the Assessor of Halfmoon. He was actually walking out there in the dark, at 9:30 at night in the back of her home, which she really has concerns about. She is not sure what he is doing out there and he has access to the back of her house.

Secondly, people are walking their dogs on the path with out leashes and are coming up on her property. The dogs are doing their business on her property and then she needs to go out and pick it up. They continually add panels of fencing on the side of their property to prevent these dogs from coming upon their property. Her husband has actually had words with these people as they have walked their dogs and they are right back there in the next couple of days. She does not feel that they should be on guard 24 hours 7 at my home watching to see who is coming on her property, who is there with their dogs, and who is walking out there in the dark. Right now the trees and leaves are growing and the access is not as clear as it is in October to April when there is wide open spaces, but the dogs are still coming through the gully. They have a fence down to a certain point and they are going to have to add on because the dogs still come on to their property.

Next she stated that the snow mobilers park by her house and are revving up their engines by her house at midnight and during the week. There is a sign 8-9 feet tall that says "No Trespassing". The Sheriff saw this and nothing was done about it, it is not being enforced. The parking lot becomes so busy at times that the cars are actually parking in front of their house all winter long. It becomes very upsetting.

It is her understanding that the property at the top of the street has been sold and they are having new homes being built. If that is the case, there is going to be even more activity going on the side of her house. Something needs to be done.

**Supervisor Wormuth** stated that were 4 things that she reviewed with her husband when they met and based on the discussions that they had, that she has contacted the Sheriff's department and asked them to increase the patrols down there and to be aware that there is a concern about people being there after dusk. She has reviewed it with the specific employee who was there, because his job had nothing to do with the reason why he was there, and does not why he identified himself as a Town employee. A member of the Sheriff's department thought that he had a reason to be there. She has discussed this with him because she understands that he has been making regular visits down there.

She has asked the Animal Control Officer to increase patrols down there and look for people who have their dogs off of their leashes and remind them of the law. When she spoke to her husband, she said that they are currently looking into having a larger sign put up, or lowering the current sign. Perhaps it would be at a better level for people to look at it.

The Supervisor understands her concern. She stated that it was difficult to see a direct path with a close proximity into her yard without traversing what she would consider a pretty significant amount of brush and wetlands. She also understands that one of the utility companies was down there and cut quite a bit and that has made a difference for them.

**Donna** stated that they had a little bit of a barrier and then the Town came in and started cutting. Donna wrote a letter and put it on their window asking them to please, do not cut any further and knock down what little privacy that they have, and they did.

Supervisor Wormuth stated that it was the utility company that did the cutting and not the town. The utility company does have an easement there and they are allowed to be in there and maintain the wires. One thing that she had said to her husband that she is willing to do, is to talk to the Parks Director and see if he has any options for some plantings that might give them more privacy, or if he has any other options that he sees as perhaps viable that we could look at. She also promised her husband that they would come back in the fall as seasonally things change and impact not only the visual aspect of it but also the access to it. They are aware of it and will continue to monitor it. They are asking people to continue to increase things. The one thing the Supervisor asked of her husband, if he is dealing with a Police enforcement agency, whether it be the Troopers or the Sheriff's department, to please get a name. It makes it easier for her to access the Sheriff's, or one of the Commanders's at the Trooper's Agency and is able to follow up on this and be able to say that this is something that we want enforced. The park is closed from dusk till dawn and unless there is a water main break or another issue, there shouldn't be Town employees there; there shouldn't be anybody there.

**Donna** said that if the Sheriff's drive by, they cannot see the cars. They have to pull in the lot and physically come in to see the cars. This particular car that we are talking about, is parked behind the fence and under a tree, the cops just drive by and don't even see him. The gentleman that we are talking about, after the Sheriff's talked to him that night; he was there the next night. It had no bearing on this gentleman. If the cops are not going to issue tickets to people out there after dark, then what's the sense, she said.

**Supervisor Wormuth** stated that she did not realize how tucked in he could be. She will reiterate that as she is asking them to do patrols down there.

**Donna** said that as far as the dogs go, every time the dogs come on her property and she calls the Dog Warden, she has to submit papers to file complaint, she should not have to do that. One day there was dog excrement in her driveway that she brought into her garage. People do not have the courtesy to take care of their dogs. She said that they have brought the fence down as far as they can with out going into this gully, but still the dogs still can come in through the gully to the house.

**Supervisor Wormuth** stated that they would continue to review it and look at what options are available. Again, she wanted to reiterate that the Town did expend a considerable amount of energy and what she thought was helpful to her when Donna originally called when the parking lot first became fairly active, to help do some shielding to the property. She said that they certainly could not put up a fence the whole length of the Champlain Canal Trail, it would not be utilized in the nature that it is.

**Donna** stated that they have already put up several panels of fencing and are extending it with another 4 panels. She asked that they please look into this thoroughly and not just brush this off.

**Supervisor Wormuth** said absolutely not. That they have been down there, they have taken pictures, she has meetings set up, she will continue to work with coordinating agencies and trying to address the issue. The Supervisor told her to feel free to call her office if there is increased activity or if there is a lack of response. She reminded Donna that it might take a few days in order to get everyone organized for what they were doing, as she has only just spoken to them at the end of last week. She will remind people again tomorrow and ask that those efforts get stepped up.

Donna asked about the signs. She asked for a "Do not Park in front of the house"

**Supervisor Wormuth** said that she would ask the Highway Superintendent to contact the County DPW, because it is a county road, and see if they are willing to do that.

Donna thanked the Supervisor.

There being no further business to discuss or resolve, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 pm
