On behalf of the Town Board and myself, I am pleased to announce that the Town Budget for 2023 is complete. We are also very pleased to announce that this will be the 45th consecutive year the Town will have no general Town Tax. The Town budget shows that the Town continues to be financially very healthy as we continue to heavily invest in infrastructure for the future of Halfmoon.

The 2022 Summer Recreation program was a huge success this year with over 350 children in attendance. (Look for Summer Camp photos on page 4) We are looking forward to the Recreation Department's Fall and Winter events, including; the Learn to Ski and Snowboard program – sign up begins on October 7.

In August were honored to dedicate the Town of Halfmoon's new "National Historic District " on Church Hill Road. A ceremony was held, and Historic Markers were placed on either end of Church Hill Road. Congratulations to the current and former residents of Church Hill Road for their years of hard work and determination to make this National designation come to fruition. On the same day, a Historic Marker was also place on Betts Lane to commemorate the Betts Farm, a continuously owned and operated family farm in Halfmoon since 1856. Congratulations to the Betts Family.

I encourage you to stop by the Farmers Market. The market is open every Wednesday in the lobby of the Town Hall from 3pm to 6pm. There are a variety of vendors, who offer a variety of fresh food, fresh produce, handmade crafts, goods, essential oils, specialty goods and services.

As the holidays approach in November and December, we are reminded of those who are less fortunate. Once again, the Town of Halfmoon Recreation Department, in conjunction with the Town of Halfmoon Character Counts program will hold its Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive. Please consider donating to this annual event. Donation boxes are located at the front entrance of Town Hall and in the Recreation Office. Food baskets will be created from the donations and delivered to local seniors and families in need.

Water Less as Temperatures Drop

It is important to water your lawn less as temperatures drop as too much water can lead to disease. Temperatures change around this time of year so as temperatures drop, soil conditions also change.

Fall is one of the most optimum times of the year for disease to start appearing, especially when overwatering and shade from Fall leaves combine. Disease can be caused by several things, but it is usually caused by overwatering, changing temperatures and shade. Regardless of disease outbreaks, you will still want to water your lawn to

prevent drought stress while the grass is actively growing. Cool season lawns require about 1–1.25 inches of water per week including rainfall. Watering grass in the early morning will decrease the risk of certain turfgrass disease.



Blow Out Your Irrigation System

As winter approaches, we get our yards ready by trimming back branches, clearing out flower beds, and preparing our lawn for colder weather. Winterizing your sprinkler system is another important step in preparing for winter and must be done correctly to be effective. A sprinkler blowout is the process of pushing pressurized air through



the sprinkler system lines expelling all remaining water from the pipes. This prevents water from freezing inside of the pipes, causing corrosion, rot, and bursting pipes.

One option is to contact an irrigation service that

will come to your home and use a truck mounted air compressor to blow out your systems, or if you want to try it yourself, there are some great tutorials online.

Great Reasons to Get Outside this Winter

Temperatures may have dropped, but that is no reason to hibernate.

Animal Control

So with the advent of the cooler fall weather, you are now breathing a sigh of relief, thinking that fleas and ticks are in their death throes for the year, right?

The fact is that many fleas and ticks have been discovered to be overwintering in our area-- either outside or in, putting your beloved pet's health at risk and posing a risk to the rest of your family. Here's a primer on the most common ticks in our area, what they look like, common habitat and the diseases which they can carry to which our pets (and ourselves) can be susceptible.

1. American Dog Tick (a.k.a. Wood Tick) - largest tick in our area, brown with a white patterned area on its back. Found in grassy areas with tall foliage. Bite can cause Rocky Mountain spotted fever (RMSF) in people, tularemia in people and animals, and tick paralysis in pets.

- 2. Blacklegged Deer Tick smallest tick in our area, adults size of sesame seed, reddish brown, with a black shield on its back. Found in leaf litter, shrubby plants, and forest grasses. Bite can cause babesiosis, erlichiosis, and Powassan virus in people and Lyme disease in both people and pets.
- 3. Brown Dog Tick small elongated body, red-brown. Lives mostly indoors in dog kennels, under baseboards and other moldings and in furniture. Bite can cause RMSF, and canine babesiosis and canine erlichiosis.
- 4. Lonestar Tick rounded body, reddish brown with a single light spot on its back. Lives in wooded areas with dense underbrush and along edges of meadows and streams where deer are prevalent. Bite can cause erlichiosis and tularemia.

Fleas are small brown insects with flattened sides and powerful legs which allow them to jump distances which are many times their body size. Unlike ticks, they do not attach to their hosts for long periods of time to feed. Fleas can enter the home through pet traffic, hitching a ride in on dogs or cats and are most commonly the cat flea. Despite its name, cat fleas can feed on dogs, and other warm-blooded mammals (including people), and indeed, it can be difficult to eradicate them as larvae can develop in cracks and crevices of the home. Fleas can transmit some very serious diseases if they have previously fed on an infected animal (typhus, plague) which, thankfully, are uncommon in New York, but they can also transmit cat scratch fever and tapeworms which is much more commonly occurring.

There are many preventative measures that can be taken to protect both yourselves and your pets from suffering from flea and tick bites.

- 1. Wearing light-colored clothing sprayed with insect repellents is advisable when active in tick habitat.
- 2. Clothing and skin should be checked upon returning inside.
- 3. Use a fine-toothed comb in your hair.
- 4. Pets should also be examined after an outing for any interlopers.
- 5. Preventative tick measures for pets include collars, and both topical and oral medications which can be prescribed by a veterinarian to help keep the crawlies and their potential spread of disease at bay.
- 6. Dogs can also be vaccinated against Lyme disease.
- 7. Preventing flea infestations begins with frequent washing of pet bedding, and flea combing of your pet, checking carefully for signs of fleas including their excrement known as "flea dirt".

This is general information and you should always consult your veterinarian for the best course of action for you and your pet.

When many other avenues for senior activities and fellowship have dwindled, our Center continues to thrive and grow by leaps and bounds. Each day at noon,

the **Saratoga County Office for the Aging Home Delivered Meal Program** serves lunch at the Center. There is something everyday for you to participate in and enjoy at the Center. Come for a morning activity and stay for lunch or, come for lunch and stay for an afternoon activity!

On **November 12th** we will hold our **Annual Holiday Bazaar** from **9am to 2pm**. There will be hundreds of hand made craft items and baked goods for you to choose from, along with the ever popular, Grandma's Attic. The **Lunch Café** will be open from 11am to 1pm, to serve you delicious homemade lunch items. The bazaar will offer you the opportunity to buy your homemade baked goods for the Thanksgiving holiday and to purchase hand made gifts for Hanukkah and Christmas gift giving. Don't forget to get your raffle ticket for the beautiful handmade quilt that our Quilters made especially for this event! This is always a fun event and is open to the public. Pass the word and be sure to bring your family and your friends. All proceeds go to fund the programs and activities that are offered at the Center. A unique program that we offer is our **Alzheimer's Support Group** which meets the third Thursday of every month at 12:00pm. Caregivers enjoy a complimentary lunch together while those they care for also enjoy a complimentary lunch, before participating in a group activity. This support group is not only for those with Alzheimer's but any type of dementia as well. If you or someone you know are interested in attending, please call the Center to sign-up. All caregivers of any age whether members or non-members are welcome.

Keeping our bodies in good health is a major goal here at the Center so we offer many different activities and classes to help. The cold weather is coming so our Fitness Center is the perfect place for you to exercise, because it was designed with you in mind. There is a treadmill for you to use at your leisure. The Center offers an *Healthy Bones for Life* class every **Monday** and **Wednesday** at **9:30am**, which is sponsored by the Saratoga County Office for the Aging. Osteoporosis causes bones to lose their strength and to break. The body does make new bone tissue but not as fast as it is lost, therefore decreasing bone strength. There is no cure for osteoporosis, but it can be slowed by preventative measures. This class can help.

This class is for those that have been diagnosed with osteoporosis, and for any one who is at risk. There is no charge for this class. Registration is required through the Saratoga Office for the Aging. Join us at HealthPlex for our **Stability and Balance Class** offered every **Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday** and **Thursday** from 11:00am to 11:45am. This class helps with building strength and improving your balance through exercises that strengthen the ankle, knee and hip joints all in a fun and social setting. This class is designed specifically for fall prevention. All equipment is provided (hand weights, tubing, ball, chair). Also offered at HealthPlex is our **Core and Strength Training Class**, which is offered every **Tuesday** and **Thursday** from 10:15am to 11:00am. This class increases cardiovascular and muscular endurance. Exercises include alternating low-impact choreographed sitting and standing upper-body strength work, while incorporating lowerbody strength and core exercises. All equipment is provided (hand weights, tubing, ball, chair). Both of these classes are geared for the mature body and are tailored for the individual. The cost is \$5.00 per class for Center members. If that class



is not the right speed for you then try a new **PACE (People with Arthritis Can Exercise)** on **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays** at **10:30am**. This class focuses on the individual and is tailored to each participant's level of ability. This is an ongoing free class. Keep yourself healthy and active!!!



The Assessor's office will be mailing out the Renewal Forms for RP-467, and the application for Partial Tax Exemption for Real Property of Senior Citizens at the end of the year. These forms, along with copies of your 2021 income, must be completed and returned to our office by March 1, 2023. Please call our office at 518-371-7410 ext. 2242 with any questions regarding eligibility for this program as each school district in town has different qualifications.

Please note that if you have moved, your exemptions are not automatically transferable even within the Town of Halfmoon.

Receiver of Taxes

Dana Cunniff, Receiver of Taxes - Town of Halfmoon

At this time our office is preparing to close our records for another year. It is important that we share some information regarding the end of the year close out process and the beginning of a new year for property tax collections.

<u>Water Bills</u> are issued (twice a year) April 1st and October 1st. You have thirty (30) days to pay the bill without a penalty. If not paid within the thirty (30) days, the balance will roll over to your October bill. October water bills have a strict due date by November 1st. After that date, payments cannot be accepted

or processed (regardless of post marked date) and will be returned to sender, with no exceptions. ALL unpaid water bills and/or balances at that time are automatically added to your 2023 Property tax bill.



ALL 2023 County & Town Property Tax Bills will be available online as of January 1, 2023, for you to view, print and/or pay online. Unpaid water bills and/or School Tax Bills will be reflected on your County & Town Property Tax Bill, making the amount due higher than your actual Property taxes (review each line item). All 2023 taxes can be paid by check, cash, e-Check, debit, credit card, in person, online, mail or drop box. If do not received your property tax bill in the mail, please remember it is still due



by the 31st of January to avoid added penalties. Our office collects property taxes until May 31, 2023, at which time our records close and all unpaid tax bills are sent to the Saratoga County Treasurer's office where payments must be paid directly to them. It is a great practice when paying taxes by check to put your phone number

on your check, so if there is an issue with the check we can call right away.


HALFMOON HISTORIC MARKER BOOKLET

Parking Regulations in the Town of Halimoon: Code Enforcement Duties



The Department of Building, Planning & Development is responsible for a variety of duties and responsibilities in the Town of Halfmoon. One of the primary functions is enforcement of the certain sections of the Halfmoon Town Code. While other towns, cities and villages may have similar "local laws", it can be extremely helpful to understand what laws may be unique to your own town.

One group of local laws in Halfmoon that residents and businesses should be aware of concerns **PARKING**. Particularly during winter weather months, it is helpful to know what and when you can park on Town streets. Here is a quick summary of Halfmoon's parking laws:

- **Parking During Winter Storms:** Parking is prohibited on the pavement or shoulder of any Town highway, road or street during a snowfall, sleet, freezing rain or other winter-type weather event and for a forty-eight-hour period after the precipitation ceases.
- **Handicapped Parking:** Vehicles cannot stop, stand or park in any space designated as a place for handicapped parking unless the vehicle has a proper permit or registration used for the transportation of a handicapped or severely disabled person.

Parking in Fire Lanes: Vehicles may not be parked or left unattended by a licensed driver within any fire lane.

Parking Near Emergency Locations: Parking (other than an emergency vehicle) is prohibited on a street or roadway in front of any fire house or ambulance station or within a radius of 15 feet of any fire hydrant or within 500 feet of any building or area where a fire is located.

Fines for violating any of these sections of the Town Code can range from \$150 to \$450 for each offense. Therefore, drivers in the Town should familiarize themselves with these restrictions to avoid costly fines and penalties.







It has been another very busy summer for the Highway Department



reconstructing and paving roads this year. Prior to resurfacing, we install new culvert pipes and repair catch basins, as needed. To date we have reconstructed close to 6.5 miles of town roads that include Sunset Drive, Milford's Way, Executive Park Drive, Stone Quarry Road, Dunsbach

Road, Belleard Lane, Clamsteam Road, Riverview Road and Werner Road. More roads will be completed this year as the season and budget allows.

We hear you . . . The Highway Department is available for your needs as we continue to handle day to day issues that residents advise us of and we work diligently to mitigate the problem as soon as possible.

Our Team also continues to do routine highway maintenance items such as; tree trimming, road side mowing, shoulder repairs, pothole repairs, storm drain cleaning, street sweeping, storm drain repairs, sign repairs and transfer station duties.



As we begin to wrap up our summer operation, we are preparing for the winter. Our mechanics continue to provide routine maintenance to our large fleet of vehicles to ensure the readiness for upcoming use and our staff is preparing for inclement weather.
