The Town shall not issue certificates of occupancy that allow for overnight accommodations, or maintain, plow or, otherwise care for the roads until proof of recording of all necessary documents with the County Clerk's office are received, and this approval is conditioned on the following: (1) prior to issuance of the 3rd Certificate of Occupancy (C.O.), all street signs within the development must be installed to the satisfaction of the Town; (2) prior to issuance of the 1st C.O., the sidewalk accessing Cemetery Road from the development shall be restricted from use by residents of Eastpointe Homes in a manner satisfactory to the Town, until the time that the crosswalk striping and pedestrian crossing pedestal and signage on Cemetery Road are; (3) the emergency access drive and internal sidewalks shall be installed pursuant to the approved subdivision plan no later than the issuance of the C.O.s for the residences located on the adjacent lots.
