Supervisor Tollisen: Good afternoon, everyone! Today we have a special Town Board meeting for our seniors. It is the day that we set aside every year to celebrate Senior Citizens Appreciation Month, so welcome and thank you to all our Halfmoon Seniors for coming today!

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE and MOMENT OF SILENCE

PRESENTATION: DR. ROBINSON - SHEN SCHOOL BUDGET

Supervisor Tollisen welcomed Dr. Robinson. He always asks to come when it's the Senior Citizens Appreciation Month, we always oblige and great to have the Superintendent here with us along with his great group to let us know what is going on and about the budget. Thank you for being here today. We appreciate you and your team so come on up!

Dr. Oliver Robinson, Superintendent of Shenendehowa Central Schools was in attendance along with Rebecca Carmen, the Director of Policy & Community Outreach, Kathy Chase, Chief Financial Officer, she is the woman behind the numbers, Naomi Hoffman, Board of Education President, and Kelly Barkley with Communications person who takes the pictures! Becky is the one who collaborations with the Seniors and our students, we look forward to those opportunities. If you think that you would like to do some generational things with our students, reach out to us and we would be more than happy to try and coordinate some of those things.

I was talking with Kevin in the Lobby and we have a Science Fair at the school and the Planning Department had a booth promoting the Town of Halfmoon and it was the coolest thing ever! So, kudos to the great work that you are doing here.

I won't take long but I wanted to put the Budget Vote in perspective. I can't tell you how to vote but I strongly encourage you to come to vote. The vote will be on Tuesday, May 16th at the Gowana Gymnasium. We have Absentee Ballots for those who cannot get out and vote.

This year we have four things on the referendum:

- #1 BOARD OF EDUCATION: Mrs. Hoffman and Mrs. Miller running unopposed
- #2 BUSSES: We are dipping our toes into electric busses by purchasing 4 busses.
 - > 2035 We have to have ALL electric busses
 - > 2037 Can only purchase electric busses

#3 – RENOVATION OF 5 MAXWELL ROAD: This is the property that was donated to the school.

- > There have been talks about purchasing property in Halfmoon for a new school and it is still on the docket.
- We are going to have to do significant renovations. If we were to adopt this property for a school, we can only put them on the perimeter of the property where we have outside windows. This space will be limited and would be new construction.
- > Borrowing at a 30-year term will have very little impact on our taxpayers. We continue to work on this.

#4 - BUDGET: Places that need more – get more. We are too poor to be rich and too rich to be poor. Consequently, the State Aid has not worked to well for us. This year we saw a sizable bump up in State Aid which allows us to have a budget increase of 6.3%. No panic, the other side of the coin is that there is less relying on property tax and a greater reliance on State Aid.

- ightharpoonup Tax Impact: 10 years ago tax amount per \$1,000 = \$29.47
- ightharpoonup Tax Impact 2023 per \$1,000 = \$30.95
- > Nice to know about what you are going to be paying every year.

Dr. Robinson: Because we have been stable impact on our taxes, we can also borrow money cheaper on the other side on new construction with the credit rating. We never want to have a situation where people can't afford to live in a community because of the decision that we are making.

The budget vote is on the 16th of May. I will leave a copy of the Newsletter with you that you will be getting in the mailbox soon. I ask people to come out and vote, I can't tell you how to vote and what to vote for but I can ask you to please come out and vote. Thank you very much. This Board has always been very open and very supportive. I give kudos to Kevin. There hasn't been a time that we have reached out and he's said no and I appreciate it because at the end of the day, we are all trying to do the same thing and try to do the best for the citizens we serve. I would be happy to answer any questions if you have any.

Supervisor Tollisen: Thank you Superintendent. Thank you and your entire team for being here today, we appreciate you and all that you do for us.


