Dr. Oliver Robinson, Superintendent of Shenendehowa Central Schools: passed out the proposed 2018-19 budget to the Town Board

- Public Information newsletter coming out on May 8<sup>th</sup>

**Councilman Hotaling:** First off, I would like to thank Mr. Casey. I wish you all of the best and thank you for your community service. When you talk about an increase, what is the percentage in payroll?

Dr. Robinson: We have 1,700 employees receiving a 2.56% raise

**Councilwoman Jordan:** Thank you for having the Sheriff involved in school during the threats. I know that my son came home and said that it was a relief to see the presence of the Sheriff there and to have a continued presence afterwards. That is a plus.

My question to you is what is the status of an elementary school in Halfmoon?

## Dr. Robinson:

- Phase I Identify the land, looking at potential parcels to purchase, approximately 40 acres
- Phase II Growth Pattern: Elementary school enrollment going down and High School going up
