PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE and MOMENT OF SILENCE

PRESENTATION: TABOR ROAD FLEX & TRUCK TERMINAL PARK (COUNTY WASTE PDD AMENDMENT)

Jason Dell with Lansing Engineering: I am here this evening on behalf of the applicant Scott Earl for the Tabor Road Flex & Truck Terminal Park, amendment to the County Waste PDD. The last time the project was before the Board was in the beginning of February and you passed the project to the Planning Board for recommendation. We were before the Planning Board last week and all of the comments were addressed and we were issued a positive recommendation back to this board for the project.

Overview:

- Located at 12 Tabor Road with approximately 6.75 acres
- Zoned as part of the LIC zone. All of the properties in that area with the exception of the County Waste PDD are all zoned as part of the LIC zone
- Various use & tenants in accordance with the LIC & the County Waste PDD
- 5 buildings of varying sizes. The ultimate size will be determined when we are back before the Planning Board for Site Plan approval.
- Sewer will connect with the trunk line that traverses with Tabor Road now
- Water will be extended approximately 5,000 down Tabor Road & connect to the project

Public Benefit:

- 12" Water main down Tabor Road from where it currently terminates (1,800 feet was done by the Paar Estates public benefit) we will continue the remaining 4,600 feet to the project
- Have submitted detailed plans with CHA for their review & the Water Dept.
- Estimated cost \$552,000

We are now back before this Board to ask for a public hearing for the project.

Supervisor Tollisen: Any questions from the Board?

Councilman Hotaling: I just want to compliment you on your public benefit. I think that it is a great asset and a huge need for the northern part of town. The residents there are in serious need of a water source.

Councilman Wasielewski: Jason, we spoke at the Planning Board about moving that entrance further east to prevent any instances with the long 18 wheel trucks and the railroad crossings. Is that something that is likely to happen?

Jason Dell: As we go through the process with the Planning Board, we have looked at alternate entrances. The emergency services would also like to see a secondary

point of access. We have gone out to the site to move the actual entrance further to the east or south. The site distance there isn't significantly better but what we have looked at doing is an emergency entrance on that side of the property and that would provide the secondary means of access. So, we will work with the traffic engineers once we get back to the site plan to put that entrance in the ideal spot along there. I don't think that moving it all of the way over to the one side would make the best sense but moving it somewhere in the middle might be where it would wind up.

Councilman Wasielewski: Excellent. I would have to agree with Councilman Hotaling about the public benefit. I am sure the residents along Tabor Road and Northern Sites would agree. Thank you.
