#### REPORTS OF BOARD MEMBERS AND TOWN ATTORNEY

**Kevin J. Tollisen (Town Supervisor)** I would like to highlight that this Saturday is the Harvest Festival which is a joint project with the Halfmoon Celebrations Association of the Town of Halfmoon. It starts at noon and goes to 7 O'clock, and there will be plenty of fun for the kids all day long. There will be many vendors and shopping, and there are Chicken BBQ Tickets; we have Rolling Smoke doing a BBQ from 4 pm to 6 pm. Juke Box Rebellion will be playing from 4 pm to 7 pm, and there will be fireworks at 7 pm. This is an end of summer fun day for all.

I would like to note that there will be a Booster Vaccination Clinic here at the Town of Halfmoon at the end of October. It is not on the agenda today, but will be on the next agenda, as just today, my secretary was able to confirm there will be a clinic at the Town of Halfmoon. We have partnered with the Saratoga County Department of Health, and more details will follow as we receive them.

**Dan Ziarno, 41 Gladstone Circle:** Good evening. I see on the agenda under Old Business, that the town Board has tabled the Tribley Residential PDD until October 19<sup>th</sup>. Is that a date that a vote will be taken on it, or is it possible it could be extended beyond that?

Supervisor Tollisen: I am going to defer that to the Deputy Supervisor.

Attorney Murphy: There isn't a guarantee whether or a vote will be taken or not, it could be or could not be we are awaiting additional mapping which would demonstrate the applicant's willingness to reduce the number of houses. Until we have that and look at it, and the Board has enough to review it, they cannot tell you where they are going to go, but it is going to be on for that date.

**Dan Ziarno:** Thank you. Would there be opportunity for comment at that meeting from the public?

**Attorney Murphy:** That is not a public hearing, obviously all of the comments that have been made, or if you want to submit additional comments in writing to the Planning Department, it would be considered by this Board.

**Dan Ziarno:** Ok. I did submit a letter to the Town Board, and I did not get a response back, so that's why I was wondering if there would be an opportunity to ask the Town Board to get a response on it.

**Attorney Murphy:** The Board is in possession of all of the letters that were submitted to Planning; Mr. Harris does a wonderful job in forwarding everything

Dan Ziarno: Yes, he does.

Attorney Murphy: and we are trying to. I guess the easiest way to answer your question is in their efforts to make them re-draw the plans and come up with additional information that is in response to what people are saying in their letters. There are probably 100, and I cannot keep them all straight in my mind as to what in specific your letter said, but that is why we are tabling it because we want to make sure all of those issues are addressed. Not saying they will be complied with, but at least looked at, and a decision is made whether or not it is appropriate to have the developer do that, not do that, or not approve the project.

**Dan Ziarno:** Ok, so I guess if I understand, the question I asked specifically, may not be responded directly to me, but it may be considered in the final decision.

Attorney Murphy: Absolutely.

Dan Ziarno: Ok. Thank you very much.

Gary Heller, 12 Somerset Drive: I just have a question regarding item number 11, about the receiving the project withdrawal from the applicant being Twin Bridges Eco Park. I believe there were two phases: one was the purchase of the land, and second was the development of the Eco Park itself. Is this indicating that both of those have been withdrawn?

**Supervisor Tollisen:** We would have no knowledge of the acquisition of land or property – that would be public record at the County Clerk's Office, but the application that is before this Town Board, the application that has been submitted, has been withdrawn, so there is nothing pending for the Town at this point at all.
