To Clark Saxton Collector

of the town of Hoalfmoon in said County:—

By the Board of Supervisors of said County, you are hereby required to collect from the several persons named in the Assessment Roll hereto annexed, the several sums mentioned in the last column on each page thereof, opposite to their respective names, together with your fees for the collection thereof; and you are authorized, in case any of them shall refuse or neglect to pay such sum or sums, to levy the same by distress and sale of his or her goods and chattels, together with costs and charges of such distress and sale. You are also required to collect the sum of Fifty Cents from every person, appearing by the annexed Assessment Roll, liable to pay the same; in pursuance of the Act entitled "An Act for the Enrollment of the Militia," &c., passed April 17th, 1854. And when the name of any person between the ages of eighteen and twenty-one years shall appear on the said Roll liable to pay the said sum of fifty cents, under the provisions of the said Act, you are required to collect the same of the Father, Master, or Guardian, with whom such person shall reside, or out of any property such minor may have in the town; together with your fees. And you are hereby authorized, in case any person named in said Assessment Roll, or such Father, Master, or Guardian, with whom a minor named in said Roll shall reside, shall refuse or neglect to pay such sum or sums, to levy the same by distress and sale of his or her goods and chattels, together with the costs and charges of such distress and sale, and your fees for collection.

AND YOU ARE HEREBY REQUIRED to pay the sum of *Three hundred and Eighty five* Dollars and *ninety five* Cents to the Supervisor of said town; the further sum of *two hundred and seventeen* Dollars and *fifty* Cents, to the Commissioners of Highways of said town; the further sum of _____ Dollars and _____ Cents to the Overseer of the Poor of said town; (taking their receipt therefor;) and to the Treasurer of the County, the sum of *Eighty one* Dollars and _____ Cents, to the credit of the Military Fund of said county; and to the Treasurer of the county, the residue of the moneys so to be collected, (after deducting your fees,) which will be *Twenty six hundred and forty eight* Dollars and *fifty nine* Cents; on or before the first day of February next, for which this shall be your WARRANT. Hereof fail not.
