Crescent July 5th 1860

Whereas 35 Sheep & Lambs
the property of Silas G. Smith of
Halfmoon has been impounded in the
Town Pounds Miles White Pound
master. Now therefore I here by agree
with the said Pound master that
if he the said Pound master shall
deliver to me the said sheep and
lambs with out the payment of the
penalty required by law to be paid
that I will (if the town Expts the said
penalty of him said Pound master)
pay the said penalty and keep the
said Pound master free from all
and Expenses

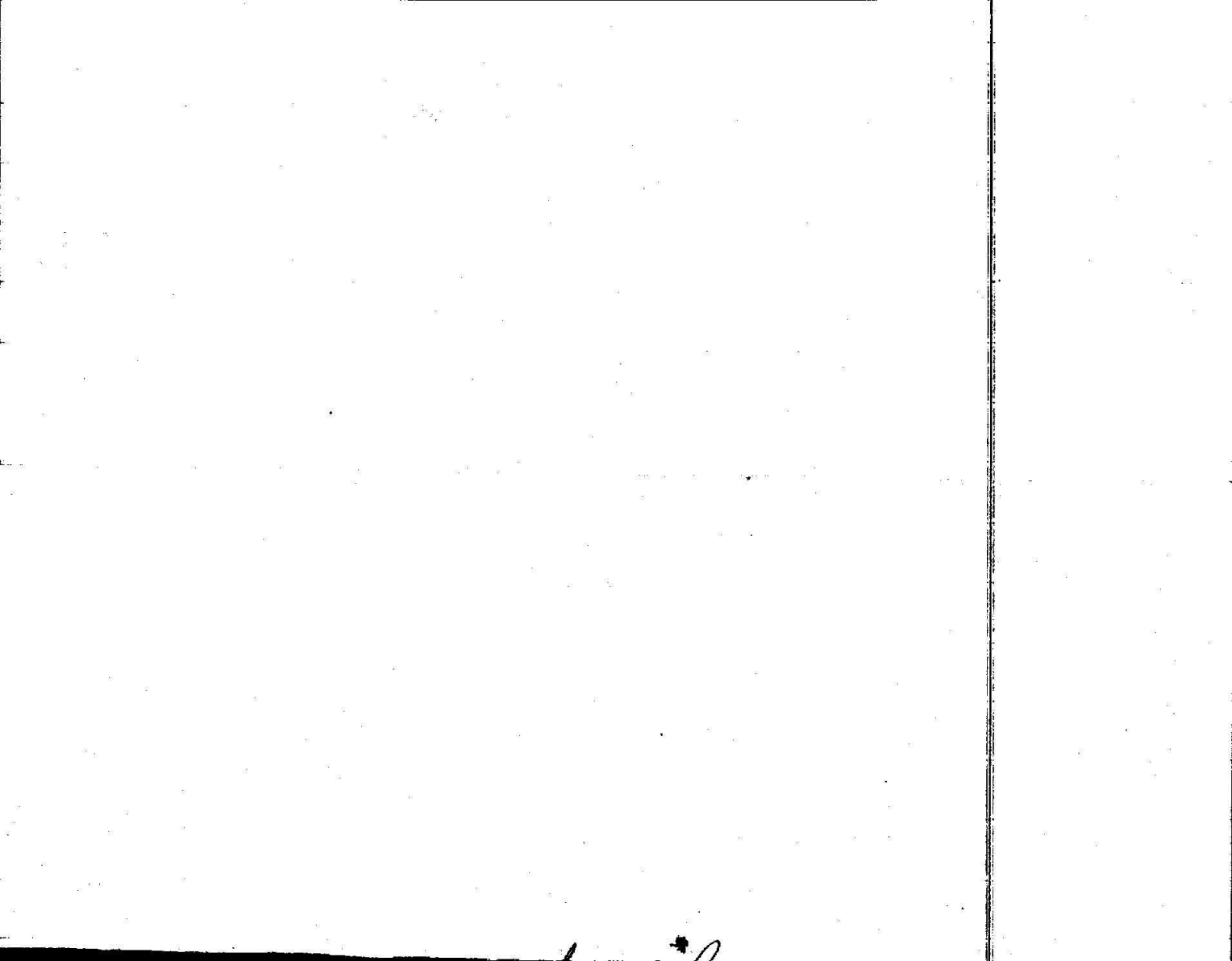
