Know all men by these presents that
we Silas H Smith and Charles H Clute and
Cornell J Smith of the town of Halfmoon County
of Saratoga & State of New York are held
and firmly bound unto Daniel R White
Supervisor of said town, in the penal sum of
one thousand dollars to be paid to the said
Supervisor, or to his Successor in office, for
which payment well and truly to be made
we bind our selves, our heirs Executors admin-
istrators and assigns jointly and severally,
firmly by these presents

Sealed with our seals, and dated this 7th day March
1879

Whereas, the above named Silas H
Smith was on the 5 day of March 1879 duly
Elected Commissioner of Highways in & for the
town of Halfmoon County of Saratoga

Now, therefore, the condition of this bond
is such that, if the said Silas H Smith shall
faithfully discharge the duties of his office as
Such Commissioner, and shall, within ten days
after the Expiration of his term of office, pay
over to his Successor all moneys remaining in
his hands as such Commissioner, and render
to such Successor a true account of all moneys
received and paid out by him as such Commis-
sioner, without fraud or delay, then this obliga-
tion to be void, otherwise to be of full force and effect
