### WARRANT OF TRUSTEES

To the collector of school district no. 6 in the town

New York:

You are hereby commanded to receive from each of the taxable inhabitants and corporations named in the foregoing list, and of the owners of the real estate described therein, the several sums mentioned in the last column of the said list, opposite to the persons and corporations so named, and to the several tracts of land so described, or so much thereof as may be voluntarily paid to you for the next thirty days after the delivery to you of this warrant, together with one cent on each dollar thereof for your fees; and after the expiration of the time above mentioned, to proceed forthwith to collect the residue of the sums not so paid in as aforesaid, with five cents on each dollar thereof for your fees; and, in case any person upon whom such tax is imposed shall neglect or refuse to pay the same, you are to levy the same by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the person or corporation so taxed, in the same manner as on warrants issued by the board of supervisors for the collection of taxes in towns; and you are to make a return of this warrant within sixty days after the delivery thereof to you; and if any tax on real estate or the taxes upon non-resident stockholders in banking associations organized under the laws of Congress, mentioned in the said list shall be unpaid at the time when you are required to return this warrant, you are to deliver to the trustees of the said district an account thereof, according to law. All moneys received or collected by you by virtue of this warrant you are to keep safely, and to pay the same on the written order of a majority of the trustees, or to the treasurer of the district if such an officer shall have been duly elected and has qualified.

To:  
School Trustees and Boards of Education

Due to recent legislation, the State Education Department will not hereafter duplicate moneys expended by local districts for library books, instructional apparatus and reproductions of standard works of art. The Department, however, is still held responsible by the Legislature for careful supervision of the expenditure of state moneys for all educational purposes. We are asking your cooperation in this matter.

During the past year the Education Department has been giving much attention to the preparation of standards for the guidance of superintendents in the selection and purchase of various items of equipment. University Bulletin No. 934 issued October 15, 1929, entitled "Standard Equipment Recommended for Rural Schools" gives superintendents and trustees information needed in the equipment of rural schools. Other bulletins and circular letters have been issued by the Visual Instruction Division giving specifications needed for the purchase of maps, globes, charts and reproductions of standard works of art.

Section 395, paragraph A, of the Education Law reads in part as follows:

"A district superintendent of schools shall have power and it shall be his duty..... to especially advise trustees relative to the employment of teachers, the adoption of text-books and the purchase of library books, school apparatus, furniture and supplies."

## DIRECTIONS TO TRUSTEES

**IMPORTANT.** The financial and statistical reports must be signed and sworn to by the trustees of the district and one copy of each deposited by them on the first day of August in the town clerk's office of the town in which the schoolhouse is situated.

A duplicate of each report should also be kept in the school records. Trustees should not pay the teacher her last month's salary until she has fully and accurately completed two copies of the statistical report and has certified to correctness of same.

Failure to make and file the report works a forfeiture of the right of the district to participate in the distribution of the school moneys. The trustees, by such neglect, become personally responsible for the amount thus lost. Every trustee wilfully signing a false report is guilty under the penal law of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding two years, or both.

If district buys and sells textbooks, lunches or other materials and supplies to pupils, a separate account of such receipts and payments should be kept. If the balance in such account is turned over to the general account or if the district paid any deficit in such account only the balance and the deficit should be included in this report.

There must be 190 days of school to entitle a district to share in public school moneys. **THIS REPORT** must be made and filed with the town clerk on the first day of August 1930, to secure to the district a share of public school moneys.
