2020 Creation

A resolution is necessary to close the project budgetary accounts within the Miscellaneous Capital Projects Fund for the Champlain Canal Trail from Upper Newtown Road to State Routes 4 & 32 (Empire State Trail). This Trail Project was funded fully in the amount of \$324,150 for engineering services by a NYS Hudson River Valley Greenway grant. The General Fund advanced the money for the project and was reimbursed as grant funds were received.
