REPORTS OF BOARD MEMBERS AND TOWN ATTORNEY

Kevin J. Tollisen (Town Supervisor) UPDATE ON THE CLOSING OF THE 2015 BUDGET

What I would like to do is take a few minutes and talk about the state of the Town Budget and do a short analysis. I think that it is important to give the state of town every now and then. The 2015 budget has ended and is just about closed and the 2016 budget has started.

General Fund: When I started was: \$28,000

2014 \$1.2 million

\$1.6 million = 26% of General Fund Budget

That would equal 3 months of operating expenses for the town on an average. The town will be creating a policy with respect this. I think that it is important that the town develop a policy regarding fund balancing and maintaining that fund balance.

Highway Fund: When I started it was in the negative

2015 \$355,000

What that means is that we are continuing on the path to improve our financial situation. I am very pleased with that. I think that we need to continue to create conservative budgets and to spend only when necessary. We have other special funds such as Recreation that you will see on the agenda tonight that we are making some improvements to our Town Park and other amenities throughout the town. Those are special funds separate and apart that we get monies from each new construction project that comes into town and with each CO. What we are experiencing here in the Town of Halfmoon is a continued improvement to the financial condition. That is no small measure. That is the path we really need to be is on. Continuing our financial improvement will not only help improve our bond rating but it will help the town in general in case there is an issue like we had in the past with an economic downturn. I appreciate the support of the Town Board with the great work that they have done. That is just a very small analysis. I plan to issue a Press Release at the end of next week. Again, good news for the Town of Halfmoon.

Paul Hotaling (Deputy Supervisor): (1) Chair of Parks & Recreation, 2) Chair of Town Infrastructure (Water, Highway, Building & Maintenance), (3) Chair of Character Counts, (4) Chair of Personnel Committee, (5) Chair of Safety Committee

Councilman Hotaling: I would like to thank the Board of Supervisors and Supervisor Tollisen for the event at the County to honor Veteran Lee Buck that I attended last week. It was a pretty amazing event to honor someone that did his job and not expecting anything in return serving his country and community. Along with that we are honoring some people tonight that have had a huge impact on our

community. I have to say that I am very honored to be part of this Town Board and to work with our employees. We had the water emergency recently. There were some people that dug in deeper and did what they had to do. Nobody looked for a pat on the back and nobody said that it wasn't my job. Even though were have grown through the years, we have still maintained the caring hometown attitude. Again, hats off to the fire service, our employees and residents for the conserving of water. We had to save a half a million gallons of water a day so that everybody could turn their water faucets on. Hats off to everyone.

John Wasielewski (Town Board Member); (1) Chair of Ethics Committee, (2) Chair of Committee on Emergency Services and Public Safety (Emergency Corps, Fire Department, Police); (3) Chair of Committee on Resident Relations, (4) Liaison to Planning Board

Councilman Wasielewski: Thank you Mr. Supervisor, I have a couple of items tonight. On the note of emergency services, we held an Emergency Services Management Interaction meeting today with all of the department heads. It was a very successful meeting with some lessons learned. The Emergency Management Plan is a living document that we continue to refine to always be ready for the next possible incident in town. We will also be meeting with the fire chiefs of the town shortly to discuss their participation in the plan.

The **Residents Relations Committee** will be meeting on Wednesday March 30th which was previously announced.

As far as Planning Board goes, I am happy to announce that there are two new Planning Board alternates; Michael Ziobrowski and Cory Custer. Those resolutions will be voted on later tonight. Thank you.

Daphne Jordan (Town Board Member): (1) Chair of Business and Economic Development (2) Chair of Insurance (Liability and Medical) (3) Liaison to Open Space and Trails Committee, (4) Zoning Board Liaison

Councilwoman Jordan: I have a few items this evening. Good news for Trails in Halfmoon. The Crescent Road Bike and Pedestrian Multi-Use Path Project actually began two days ago, on Monday, with staging activities for construction. That project location goes from Okte school in Clifton Park & heads east on Crescent Road into Halfmoon and ends on Dunsbach Road. When finished the trail will be something that people can utilize to go from one town to the next.

The other piece of good news is in regard to the **Pruyn Hill Sidewalks Safe Route to School Project**. This project has been on hold for a while because we did not have enough money to complete the project so we could not start it. We did have grant money to begin with but found that we were short. We have just been informed that we will be receiving the additional \$130,000 in grant money needed to fully fund the project.

The third item involves the **Erie Canal Connector Trail**, which is the trail that will begin at the Vischer Ferry Preserve in Clifton Park and end at Towpath Road and Clamsteam Road in Halfmoon. This is a trail that will go along the original Erie Canal Towpath and connect the two towns. Our Highway department has actually started clearing trees for that in the past week. Clifton Park side has also started clearing trees on their side as well. So, we are underway!

I also wanted to bring to everyone's attention that the **Canal Clean Sweep will be happening Saturday April 23rd** starting at 10:00 in the morning. You are all welcome to come. We meet at the left side of the Crescent Bridge as you are coming from Halfmoon. It usually lasts an hour and we do pick up a lot of garbage and it looks very nice afterwards.

The next thing that I have to report is from the **Business and Economic Development Committee**. I spoke about this at the last meeting but we are still collecting advertising. This year Halfmoon is going to be making a JIMAPCO map in conjunction with the Southern Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce. Clifton Park has done it for many years and now we are going to have a Halfmoon map. We will be collecting ads. Usually they are 3x2 ads that go around the outside border of the map. The ads help to pay for most of the cost of the map. If you are interested I have information and applications. A single ad is \$425. We are going to have 5,000 of these maps made and distributed that can be used for a very long time, so it is well worth it. If you are a Chamber member you get a discount and then it would cost \$325. If you are interested, please see me.

It is paying off as we are seeing results in the form of finance. I just want to congratulate everybody for their hard work and efforts.

Baseball season is coming soon with the nice weather spring fever has come. One thing that I would like to bring up is that the fields are still pretty wet and sloppy, they are not as dry as you would think, so please use due diligence if you choose to use the fields because you could damage them. Also there is no open burning until May 15th. That has been enacted by the NYS DEC and that is due to the lack of winter that we had or as I call it, the modified spring. So please be aware of that.

I would also like to echo my colleague Mr. Wasielewski's congratulations to Michael Ziobrowski and Cory Custer for their upcoming appointment to the Planning Board as alternates as well as Peter Gemellaro and Kevin Koval for their appointments to the Zoning Board as alternates and to Debbie Curto as a sitting member of the Zoning Board. She has put in many years as an alternate and will now be a sitting member.

Another congratulations goes out to the Shen boys and girls and even though they fell short from winning the state title simultaneously, they put in a valiant effort and their hard work and dedication should be noticed, so I would like to congratulate them for their run at the state basketball championship.
