## MEETING REPORT - HALFMOON TRAILS AND OPEN SPACE COMMITTEE (TOSC) May 16, 2022

1. OPENING – We were ready to open the meeting at 7:00 pm, in the Halfmoon Town Hall and on-line via Whereby. However, we did not have a quorum. Therefore, I'm calling this a meeting report - not minutes.

- 3. GRANT PROJECT UPDATE The March 2022 Grant Department Report was discussed. It was noted that the report is providing good information. PJ provided additional insight into various items, especially the damage to and correction of the Vosburgh Road Preserve.
- 4. TOSC ORGANIZATIONAL DISCUSSIONS –John discussed his4/25/22 meeting with Kevin Tollisen to seek more active TOSC members, better town involvement, etc. Our meeting dates are currently set for 7/18, 9/19, and 11/21/22. However, these could change to promote Town Board Liaison participation.
- 5. Town Sponsored Trail Walks on Zim Smith and CCT John distributed a flier about a 6/4/22 Townsponsored walk (or golf-cart ride) on the Zim Smith extension. It starts at Coons Crossing at 10:30 with a town transportation to start at the Elizabeth Street trailhead. At Coons Crossing, there will be picnic lunch after the 2.5 mile return walk. We were all pleased with this but could endorse it without a quorum.

A similar CCT walk, between Upper Newtown Road and Lighthouse Park, might happen in September.
